MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

The name of the Society is Speed Skate Nova Scotia Association.

On a volunteer and non-profit basis the objectives of the society are:

- To promote, develop and govern the sport of speed skating in all its forms in Nova Scotia;
- To encourage and promote recreational and competitive skating, the development of speed skating clubs, and the certification of coaches and officials;
- To acquire by way of grant, gift, purchase, bequest, devise or otherwise, real and personal property and to use and apply such property to the realization of the objects of the Society;
- To buy, own, hold, lease, mortgage, sell and convey such real and personal property as may be necessary or desirable in the carrying out of the objects of the Society.

Provided that:

- The society shall not carry on any trade, industry, or business;
- All funds shall be used solely for the purposes of the Society and the promotion of its objects.

Upon dissolution of the society and after payment of all debts and liabilities, its remaining property shall be distributed or disposed of to:

- Qualified donees described in subsection 149.1(1) of the Income Tax Act ("charitable purposes"); or
- Non-profit organizations in Canada having objects similar to those of the society.

The activities of the Society are to be carried on in Nova Scotia. The Registered office of the Society is located at 198 Windmill Road, Dartmouth NS B3A 1E9.

This Memorandum of Association was introduced through a Special Resolution to amend the Constitution and By-Laws of Speed Skate Nova Scotia Association by revoking the existing Speed Skate Nova Scotia Constitution and By-Laws document in its entirety and replacing that document with this new Speed Skate Nova Scotia Association Memorandum of Association together with new Speed Skate Nova Scotia Association By-Laws.

This Special Resolution was introduced at the Annual General Meeting of Speed Skate Nova Scotia Association held on July 24, 2014, following notice to the members as required, and passed unanimously by the accredited members present, in accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws in effect at that time.
